TAKING LEARNING TO THE LEARNER'S DOORSTEP

While rural India's youth are increasingly connected via mobile and internet (more than **82%** rural youth in India can access the internet), indicating a digital shift, the application of these technologies for meaningful advancement remains constrained. Though basic digital literacy, such as messaging and copy-and-paste tools is expanding, a significant gap exists in crucial skills for professional and financial empowerment, including internet searches, email communication, video conferencing, online banking, and other job-specific competencies.

This disparity highlights the urgent need for structured interventions in underserved rural areas. The mere presence of technology does not guarantee its effective use. To fully leverage digitalization and ensure equitable growth, targeted programs bridging the skill gap and empowering rural youth with advanced digital competencies are essential, enabling their transition from passive consumers to active contributors in the digital economy, and fostering sustainable development and improved livelihoods.

The **Digital Bus** Program from **NIIT Foundation** is a novel solution bringing this learning to their doorstep. The implementation is simple and standardised, taking into account not just the learning requirements but also the safety and security of student beneficiaries and the physical infrastructure.

Complimenting and leveraging the government's Digital India initiatives with structured programs that impart advanced digital competencies and job-specific skills, we can ensure that rural India not only connects to the digital world but actively participates in and benefits from its transformative potential.

NIIT Foundation is deeply committed to providing equal opportunities for all. In a shared vision with our valued stakeholders, we sought an innovative solution to reach individuals in remote and underserved villages. The answer is the Digital Bus. This mobile classroom, a novel and impactful initiative, allows us to extend our reach by catering to small populations in remote locations, before seamlessly moving on to the next community.

The Digital Bus comes equipped with up to **20 computers**, indoor and outdoor digital screens, and reliable **5G-enabled** internet connectivity established through mobile hotspots. Recognizing the critical importance of consistent power supply, each Digital Bus is fitted with solar panels, ensuring self-sufficiency. Recognizing the diverse needs of our beneficiaries, the Digital Bus initiative offers a range of programs, including digital literacy and financial literacy courses for all age groups, Basic IT courses, Cyber security, and career programs in IT/ITES.

Launched in 2018, the first Digital Bus was deployed in Vadodara, Gujarat. Since then, the **21 digital buses** operate across **13 states** reaching **343 locations**. Till March 2025, the initiative has positively impacted approximately **4,58,290 beneficiaries**. Beyond skills training, the Digital Bus facilitates mass literacy programs by disseminating information about government schemes and assisting adults in navigating online portals. The strategically placed outdoor digital screens become community gathering points, drawing villagers to learn vital information about policies and schemes.



The **Digital Bus** initiative also plays a crucial role in empowering girls and women who face travel restrictions due to societal norms. By parking the bus within village proximity and conducting door-to-door campaigns—a key strategy for community mobilization—we have successfully encouraged greater female enrolment. Women have also emerged as powerful advocates, motivating their peers to participate and serving as inspiring role models.

The true impact of the Digital Bus resonates in the voices of those whose lives it has touched:

*"My name is **Saraswati Yadav**. I am from **Lotlota, Dist. Korba**. Thank you for bringing this opportunity to us. It has opened up a whole new world for me. I hope to continue learning," shares Saraswati Yadav from Chhattisgarh, highlighting the transformative potential the Digital Bus has unlocked in her life.*

Sunita Tirki, a homemaker from **Ayodhyapuri, Jamnipali, Chhattisgarh**, expresses her gratitude for the practical skills gained: *"I attended a digital literacy session and learned a lot of new things, like how to pay bills and book train tickets online. Thank you to NIIT Foundation for the helpful session."*

Looking ahead, **NIIT Foundation** is committed to expanding the reach of this transformative initiative while also prioritizing environmental sustainability. Efforts are underway to transition towards **e-Buses** and actively promote climate awareness and tree plantation drives. With my years of experience in public health, I have witnessed firsthand how awareness and education can transform lives, and this session was a testament to that.

The enthusiasm and curiosity of the students were truly inspiring. They actively participated, asked thoughtful questions, and engaged in discussions that helped break long-standing taboos surrounding menstrual health. Creating an open and supportive environment where young girls could speak freely about their concerns was one of the most rewarding aspects of this session.

What made this initiative even more impactful was the participation of Digital Transformation Vehicles (DTVs) from various locations, extending the reach of our discussion to many more students beyond the physical classroom. To further support the students, each of them was provided with a packet of sanitary pads and a pen—a small yet meaningful gesture to emphasize the importance of both health and education.

The dedication of the school's teachers and staff played a crucial role in making this session a success. This session reaffirmed my belief that change begins with awareness. By equipping young minds with knowledge and confidence, we can pave the way for a healthier and stigma-free future. Case STORIES



Parvez, hailing from a family of six, from Sherpur, Dehradun faced several challenges. Despite his academic promise, financial constraints forced him to halt his education. After finishing 12th grade, he took on work to support his family, especially as his sister's wedding approached and his father's earnings were not sufficient. He secured employment at a private organization, but his lack of computer skills became a significant obstacle to advancement. In a computer-driven workplace, this hindered his potential. Discovering free computer courses by the Digital Bus, Parvez, undeterred by the 15km commute, attended classes regularly. His dedication and eagerness to learn made him a standout student, culminating in successful course completion.

Parvez's hard work and newly acquired skills yielded a promotion to supervisor, significantly improving his family's financial stability. However, Parvez's journey did not end there. Driven by a passion for continuous learning and a desire to uplift others, he expressed a strong interest in helping establish the Digital Bus sessions in his village. His determination is encapsulated in his words: "I will not stop here; I will learn more and teach others also." Parvez's story exemplifies how determination, hard work, and access to education can transform lives. His journey, from a struggling young man to a successful supervisor, underscores the impact of skills development and the importance of supporting educational initiatives in underserved communities. His willingness to give back reflects his dedication to community empowerment.

Atiya Parween, from Neory Vikas, Ranchi, grew up in a rural village where education was a luxury. Her father worked as an auto driver and her mother was a housewife, yet they prioritized Atiya's education, enabling her to finish primary school. At 14, an accident left her father unable to work, forcing Atiya to move in with her maternal uncle to continue her education. In her village, there were no facilities offering computer education, making her desire to learn about computers seem unattainable until she discovered the Digital Bus, offering free digital literacy courses. Enrolling in the "Program in Digital Awareness" marked a transformative point in her life, providing structured learning and practical skills that boosted her confidence. The curriculum covered digital literacy, from basic computer skills to internet usage. This transformative experience boosted her confidence and enabled her to participate actively in the digital world.

The program's impact on Atiya's life has been profound. She now possesses new skills that enhance her personal and professional prospects. Sharing her knowledge within her community, she has inspired others to seek similar opportunities. Despite challenges like adjusting to life with her uncle and traveling long distances for resources, her determination and the support from her family and the foundation helped her succeed.

Women's participation in the workforce is crucial for economic and social progress. Over the past few years, India has seen a significant rise in women joining the labour market, thanks to government policies, private sector initiatives, and evolving societal norms. However, despite these gains, challenges such as wage gaps, workplace safety, and access to childcare continue to hinder women's long-term career growth. Bridging these gaps requires a collective effort from businesses, non-profits, and the government. This article explores the factors influencing women's workforce participation, the hurdles they face, and the steps needed to prepare them for future job opportunities.

The recent rise in women joining the workforce in India

The recent rise in women joining the workforce is evidenced by the latest data shared by the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) 2023-24. It was revealed that the Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) for women was 41.7 per cent.

In 2018, the LFPR for women was only 23.3 per cent. The significant growth in the past six years can be attributed to multiple reasons including economic recovery, self-employment, educational attainment, gradual societal shift, and various government initiatives. For example, MGNREGS mandates that at least one-third jobs provided under the scheme should be allocated to women.
