**Umrav Ahmed**, a bright student from **Jhandapur Village, Sahibabad**, faced a common challenge many young people encounter after completing 12th grade: how to secure a stable future. His path took a turn during a community visit when an NIIT Foundation mobilizer introduced him to the free, career-oriented program at the Ciena Career Building Center. Intrigued, Umrav visited the center, received counseling, and enrolled at the **Ciena Shyam Park Center**. Throughout the Career Edge IT Professional program, Umrav's dedication shone through. He actively participated in discussions, diligently honing his professional skills, computer proficiency, and communication abilities with the support of his trainers.

Umrav's success story illustrates the transformative power of skill-based education and the profound impact of community-driven support. His journey, from feeling lost to securing a stable job, serves as a powerful inspiration for others to pursue education and skill development, regardless of their circumstances. His newfound confidence and professional skills have empowered him to contribute significantly to his family's financial stability and become a productive member of society.

## CASE STORY 2

Meet **Vandana Saini**, a resilient 19-year-old from **Shastri Nagar, Jaipur**, whose journey embodies hope and determination. Her father, a contract labourer, struggled to provide for five children, making education a constant challenge for Vandana due to financial hardships and limited family support. Despite these odds, encouragement from an NGO worker, Mrs. Yashoda, inspired Vandana to complete her 12th grade in 2024.

Her path took a new turn when she discovered NIIT Foundation's free, job-oriented BPO training program, funded by **Angel One**. Vandana joined without hesitation. The program's Career and Life Management Skills (CMLS) sessions, especially the Grief Cycle Tool, built her confidence and equipped her with vital life skills. She then gained practical, job-relevant knowledge in computer and BPO classes.

Feeling truly empowered to shape her career, Vandana has already encouraged 15 girls from her community to enrol alongside her. She now looks forward to securing a good job and becoming a changemaker, not just for her family but for the entire community.

5 लाख युवाओं को मिला प्रशिक्षण, 27,000 से ज्यादा को मिली नौकरी

विश्व का 2024-25 के दौरान एनआईआईटी फाउंडेशन ने अपने तरह-तरह के कौशल विकास कार्यक्रमों के जरिए 5,28,468 लोगों को प्रशिक्षण देकर सर्टिफिकेट दिया। इनके अलावा, 38,519 लोगों को पैसे और डिजिटल तकनीक से जुड़ी जरूरी जानकारी दी गई। स्कूलों में डिजिटल शिक्षा और एसटीईएम (साइंस, टेक्नोलॉजी, इंजीनियरिंग और मैथ) से जुड़े कार्यक्रमों के जरिए 5,07,605 बच्चों तक पहुंचा गया। इन सभी लाभार्थियों में करीब 50% महिलाएं थीं। 10,695 बच्चों ने रोल-इन-द-वेल लर्निंग स्टेशन का इस्तेमाल किया। इन्हें करीब इलाकों में लक्ष्य मिला था। वे ऐसे डिजिटल सेंटर हैं जहाँ बच्चों खुद से पढ़ाई कर सकते हैं और बुनियादी चीजें सीख सकते हैं। एनआईआईटी फाउंडेशन को सर्वोच्च सम्मान मॉडर्न जॉन ने कहा, रफाउंडेशन ने अब तक बहुत अच्छा काम किया है। हमारा मकसद है कि हम देश के और भी ज्यादा युवाओं को ट्रेनिंग दे, सर्टिफिकेट दें और उन्हें नौकरी दिलाएं। हम चाहते हैं कि 2047 तक भारत पूरी तरह से हुनरमंद (सिकल्ड) देश बन जाए। एनआईआईटी फाउंडेशन की पहल का एक अहम हिस्सा यह है कि उनके कार्यक्रमों से ट्रेनिंग और सर्टिफिकेट पाने वाले युवाओं को नौकरी भी मिल सके। इस मकसद को पूरा करने के लिए फाउंडेशन ने कई बेरोजगारों और संस्थाओं के साथ सहयोग किया है, और ये सहयोग लगातार बढ़ रहे हैं।

### NIIT Foundation enables 27,000+ job placements; 50% beneficiaries are women

The Foundation has skilled and certified over 5.2 lakh youth from underserved communities across India

NIIT Foundation, a non-profit education society/organisation, has been consistently empowering underserved communities pan India by facilitating education, imparting skills and placing individuals in high-quality jobs. In the quarter ending March 2025, NIIT Foundation certified 5,28,468 students and provided financial and digital literacy training to 38,519 individuals. About 50 per cent of these individuals were women who are now ready to take charge of their families' financial planning.

The Foundation equips youth with in-demand technical and soft skills with the aim of bridging the digital divide. It leverages technology to enable learning and provides counselling to ensure that trained students are job-ready. Over five lakh school children were impacted through programmes such as school digitalisation and STEM activity modules.

The Foundation installed Hole in the Wall Learning Stations (HIWEL) in various slums, and underserved areas. When provided with quality infrastructure, these learning stations have proven that underprivileged children are willing to learn and utilise their available resources to the full extent possible.

Sapna Moudgil, CEO, NIIT Foundation, remarked that, "the strides taken by NIIT Foundation have been exceptional, and we aim to train, certify and place many more youth across the country. We are committed to making India a 100 per cent skilled nation by 2047".

NIIT Foundation is committed to ensuring job placement for certified youth. It has partnered with various companies for this purpose, including IBM, Johnson Matthey and United Way Mumbai, TATA Steel Foundation, UNICEF, Infosys, Deloitte, ITC, HDFC ERGO, SAT Krishna Angel One and DXC Technology. These partnerships have enabled the job placement of 27,321 students who were trained under various programmes focused on emerging technologies and other in-demand skills.

The curriculum of NIIT Foundation has been expanded to offer specialised courses in AI & data analytics, digital marketing, cyber security, and web designing. These certifications significantly enhance employability and serve as key differentiators during placements. Additionally, NIIT Foundation strongly emphasises developing essential soft skills, such as communication, teamwork, problem-solving, and critical thinking, that are vital for professional success.

### IMPACT OF DIGITAL LITERACY AT THE SCHOOL LEVEL

Impact of Digital Literacy at the School Level by Charu Kapoor, Country Director, NIIT Foundation

Q. What are the biggest challenges in ensuring skill development programs lead to meaningful employment, especially for youth from underserved communities?

Even the best-designed programs struggle when there's a mismatch between what's taught and what employers need. Curricula can be outdated, focusing on narrow technical proficiencies rather than the transversal 'soft' skills including communication, teamwork, problem-solving that today's recruiters prize.

At NIIT Foundation, for instance, we work closely with industry and subject matter experts to ensure that student development is in-tune with industry needs. At our Career Development Centers (CDC), students are skilled with the necessary soft skills to complement their professional skillset.

Youth from underserved communities also face informational and social-capital gaps because they may lack mentors, summer internships, or networks that open doors. Logistical barriers including transportation, childcare, digital access further erode competition rates.

Q. How can digital literacy and STEM education at the school level influence long-term employability outcomes?

Early exposure to digital tools and STEM inculcates a mindset for experimentation, and computational thinking, equipping students to adapt as technologies evolve. Longitudinal studies, such as PISA's digital literacy assessments, find that students who develop coding skills and problem-solving habits by age 15 are twice as likely to pursue STEM careers and report higher job stability in their twenties. Moreover, digital fluency reduces later training costs for employers, making graduates more competitive. In regions where basic ICT labs are integrated into curricula, youth unemployment rates drop compared to peers without such exposure since they have higher employability outcomes.

Q. In what ways can corporate partnerships go beyond funding to enhance the effectiveness of skilling initiatives?

When corporations simply write checks, programs often lack relevance and industry buy-in. The most impactful partnerships involve co-creating curricula that mirror real-world workflows, co-mentoring students, and offering paid apprenticeships or internships.

Companies can donate older, but still functional, equipment, giving learners hands-on experience. Employee volunteering for guest lectures and project-based challenges exposes students to corporate culture. Evidence from NIIT Foundation's work has suggested that outcomes are superior with corporate involvement right at the get-go, for the students and for the company.

Our partnerships with large corporations including Microsoft India, Infosys and many others are not merely limited to funding. Partnering with nonprofits like NIIT Foundation who have deep expertise in implementing skill training, have ensured project efficacy, industry exposure for students and many other factors that have ensured successful outcomes-driven interventions for youth.

Q. How do self-guided learning models in low-resource settings impact children's educational outcomes compared to traditional classroom methods?

At NIIT Foundation, we undertake both models. For example, our Hole in the Wall Learning Stations are designed for self-learning by students in low resource areas such as slums. Children learn through trying, failing and learning together, and this has proven highly effective for learning outcomes for children. When children are provided the tools, it has led to higher retention and motivation than lectures, especially for foundational literacy, numeracy and digital skills.

However, without structured guidance, some learners may struggle with self-discipline or miss feedback on misconceptions. Blended approaches, pairing periodic teacher check-ins with self-paced materials, tend to yield the best outcomes, combining the adaptability of self-study with the accountability and social interaction of traditional classrooms.

Q. What systemic changes are needed to align skilling efforts with the evolving demands of the modern job market?

To bridge the gap between workforce skills and evolving industry needs, education systems must integrate agile curricula co-developed with employers and sector bodies. Regularly updated competency frameworks ensure training remains relevant to emerging technologies and processes. A major component is to embed work-based learning opportunities such as internships, and projects to give learners real world exposure.

Today, we are seeing that many skills are becoming quickly outdated. Therefore, to address evolving demands, there needs to be a clear consensus established between industry, government and skill training institutes to ensure that the alignment is future oriented, and not to simply meet existing needs for the next 6 months to 1 year.

Q. What systemic changes are needed to align skilling efforts with the evolving demands of the modern job market? and How can digital literacy and STEM education at the school level influence long-term employability outcomes?

Systemic reforms require agile, industry-informed curricula regularly updated through robust mechanisms to anticipate emerging skill needs. Continuous professional development for educators ensures teaching methodologies evolve with technological advances and changing economic landscapes.

Digital literacy and STEM education at the school level lay critical foundations for long-term employability. Early exposure to digital tools and computational thinking cultivates a generation comfortable and proficient with technology, which is fundamental to almost every modern job. STEM education, beyond rote learning, should emphasize inquiry-based learning, experimentation, and problem-solving, fostering analytical capabilities and an innovative mindset. This foundational knowledge equips them with transferable skills essential for adapting to new technologies and career paradigms throughout their working lives.
