Sanctity of a Process

I don't count cooking in my areas of expertise – not by any stretch of imagination. Yet programs such as Master Chef are my all-time favourite programs on TV. I find immense inspiration in watching the participants follow a process detailed in a recipe leading to beautiful and predictable dishes. If there is a change in the sequence of steps or if steps are skipped in a recipe, there is no guarantee what results will emerge.

The same is true of any work related process, isn't it?

At NIIT Foundation we are working to create students who actively work to improve their own lives and take action to improve others' lives as well.

Towards this NF team is learning many new processes — how to have more meaningful community meetings, how to handle conflict, how to engage with students deeply etc. Yet I notice a lot of us don't maintain the sanctity of a process we have learned. We like to improvise, like to skip steps and then are surprised when the result is not exactly what we hoped for. I appreciate that the intention is not wrong, that sometimes we feel unsure about the audience — that the underprivileged community may not be able to understand the process in its entirety - so we skip steps. I feel doing that is a great injustice to the community — we are guilty of underestimating their capability. In our experience where ever we have followed the complete process however much time it may take, we have seen amazing results! I think Abraham Lincoln agrees.

Of the 26.81 million persons with disabilities (PwD) which constitute about 1% of India's population 4.1 million fall in the bracket of employability. However most of them are unskilled and therefore remain unemployed.

On the one hand when education and training for those PwD at the bottom of the pyramid are available, it is unaffordable. On the other, when affordable it lacks quality and is not good enough to fetch them employment. This compels millions of PwD to be dependent on their families and caregivers.

NIIT Foundation has always been sensitive towards this issue and has offered a variety of skill-training programs to differently abled youth.

Skilling Up Differently abled:
Need of the hour

Most of the PWD (People with disability) candidates enrolled at NIIT Foundation centres opt for courses related to Data entry, Retail and Hospitality Sector. We have recently collaborated with Microsoft India to initiate a special program for visually impaired school going students & second phase of this project will focus on students with an orthopaedic impairment.

The placement cell at NIIT Foundation diligently places PwD in organizations which have special positions for such candidates and gives them an opportunity to grow. Organizations like Lemon Tree Chain of Hotels, Big Bazaar, Aegis BPO and various others have been hiring such students from NIIT Foundation centres. These organizations have helped us in the mission to promote inclusivity and integrate the differently-abled into the mainstream functioning.

Our challenge is to do more in the same amount of time. We are trying to change the way they look at themselves - not simply an individual with a job but as an active contributor to the national economy.

THE CHANGEMAKERS

Going by the vision of NIIT Foundation - "We will use skilling and education to show demonstrable deep impact in every underserved community we work in", we have chosen to bring it to practice through our work in communities by ensuring that every NF student becomes a change maker. Our mission is to create 500,000 change makers by 2020.

To make our students change makers, we at NF needed to change the way we have been working with the students, thus a need for Organizational Transformation. Using an innovative methodology called "Genuine Contact", the entire NF team underwent introspective training, learning and experiencing new tools and facilitation methods for engagement with people. Each NF team member learnt through introspection and observation while deeply engaging in the process.

The team is slowly & gradually working to implement their learning & make Changemaker's an integral part of NF culture.



PARTNER'S PERSPECTIVE

Microsoft India's initiative for visually impaired students.



NIIT Foundation has recently entered into partnership with Microsoft to implement the "Accessibility and Education Project" for students with disabilities.

This project is running at few selected schools exclusively for visually impaired students. The second phase of this project will focus on proposed school which will be an inclusive school that will cater to students with orthopaedic disability too.

The project is implemented in one integrated school – where disabled students learn with normal students (inclusive). The classrooms set up have all ICT (Information and Communication Technologies) teaching and learning resources, which can help disabled students and shall help teachers make their learning teaching experience engaging and interactive.

The standard digital classroom infrastructure with some special items have been deployed:

- 1. Special Keyboards that allow students with compromised limb movement to operate the laptop
- 2. Classrooms are offered mix of laptops and netbooks devices
- 3. NIIT Foundation has identified trainer who can act as resident facilitator the program will cater to all students with all kinds of disabilities so NIIT Foundation has engaged a trainer who would be able to work on different disabilities.
- 4. Special Hardware and Software working with visually impaired students will demand new technology and applications that can be incorporated with the digital devices.
